In the summer of 2018, we launched the Seniors Support and Rent Bank and the seniors in Metro Vancouver area can now receive an interest free loan to deal with their temporary financial difficulties. We hope to expand this program to serve more seniors who are in need of financial assistance.



Throughout the year, we became involved in research projects for the Seniors Housing Issue and formed partnerships with many other service providers in the sector. We have worked to stay connected and to strengthen our services in order to jointly serve seniors in our communities more effectively. One of these initiatives is the Seniors Inter-Agency Network. We continue to play a key role with this initiative.

We successfully supported seniors in New Westminster with our Support Services Programs for the past year. Many of them enjoyed our Bus Trips to dining clubs, received hot and nutritious meals through the Meals on Wheels Program, received Friendly phone calls, and had their groceries delivered on cold and rainy days. Dedicated volunteers commit their time to keep delivering these valuable and essential services to our clients, and I wish to express our sincere "Thank You" to those who help us.

I also want to acknowledge the passing of Ivor Brown. He was a past board member and volunteered his time to support our programs. He delivered meals to our clients and drove our clients to medical appointments. He was always willing to assist when we needed help. He was well respected in his community and by all of us at Seniors Services Society. He is very greatly missed.

For this coming year, all staff members, volunteers, and management team will join the force and keep on delivering the services that seniors need and deserve.

#### **Housing Services**

Individualized information for seniors' housing in the Metro Vancouver with our Housing Counsellor. One-on-one housing outreach for clients who are homeless and at-risk. A Temporary Housing Program, providing short term accommodation to homeless seniors who are independent.



#### **Support Services**

A broad range of services for New Westminster seniors to support their independence and wellness. Programs include Meals-on-Wheels, Medical Transport, Light Housekeeping, Lunch and Dining Club, Out & About Bus Trips, Shopping Trips, Grocery Shopping, Support Calls, Tax Clinic & Outreach, and Food Security/Access Programs.



#### **Community Education**

The Society gives presentations and workshops on topics relating to seniors housing and support services. Housing Counsellor Training is offered twice a year for service providers, volunteers, and community members who wish to learn more about providing information and referral for seniors.

#### **SAFER FOR SENIORS**

On August 30th, 2018 the Seniors Services Society's boardroom became the stage for a special press conference. Dignitaries present included the Honourable Judy Darcy, Minister of Mental Health and Addiction and MLA for New Westminster, the Honourable Anne Kang, Parliamentary Secretary, and the Honourable Selina Robinson, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

All were on hand for Minister Robinson's announcement: an expansion of the eligibility requirements and an increase of benefits through the Rental Assistance Program and Shelter Aid for Elderly Renters (SAFER). The increase in funding (an additional \$78 per month for recipients- a 42% increase) came as great news for many seniors around the province struggling to make ends meet.

The maximum gross household income to qualify for benefits was also raised from \$35,000 to \$40,000, meaning more struggling low-income seniors now qualify for much-needed benefits. These changes to funding and accessibility will have a far-reaching and favourable impact on the lives of seniors throughout Metro Vancouver, and through the entire province of British Columbia.

#### **LION'S MANOR FIRE**

On July 24<sup>th</sup> of 2018, a fire gutted the Lion's Manor seniors' home in Deep Cove, Vancouver. The blaze left 66 seniors displaced out of their homes, seven of whom had nowhere to turn. The Seniors Services Society was called upon to help ensure those seven seniors would not fall to the wayside.

The following email was sent to the Seniors Services Society in May 2019 by one of those seven seniors. It is unedited, with only the senior's name withheld out of respect for their privacy.

#### **Email Subject: Appreciation**

It's been 10 months now since the fire at Lion's Manor that devastated my life as I knew it to be. In an instant everything changed. Although I suffered only minor injuries, the impact of that day was tremendous. I lost everything except the clothes on my back.

And I became homeless.

The community support and emergency resources were immediate. I am so grateful.

I was referred to Seniors Services Society. They took me under their wing so to speak.

Stephen was assigned to me and my life quickly filled with hope.

Stephen worked hard to take care of my immediate needs (temporary furnished housing, food, personal care items) and guided me in finding a residence that would provide a safe and convenient home to me while The Manor was being restored.

Stephen made himself available to me if I had any concerns. He was empathetic to my situation and was so pleasant and respectful. I didn't feel like a victim.

I moved into the Seniors Services Society's temporary housing unit in November and it has become my home for the time being as I hope to get back to my "forever home" early 2020.

Thank you for all the support and help you provided me in starting over. I appreciate every bit of it...you made a difficult situation bearable. Thank you Stephen.

One day I will pay it forward.

#### **NEW MEMBERSHIP PROCESS:**

New membership applications will be forwarded to the committee; one member will call, welcome them as a new member, and ask a few questions to get to know them better. Once complete this information will be forwarded to the Seniors Services Society's Office Administrator for processing.

Once completed the committee members will make contact for potential new memberships. A letter will be used to encourage memberships, and a follow up phone call will take place after it is sent. #### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

Overall, the 2018/2019 fiscal year was the beginning of a turning point year from a financial viewpoint. Although, expenses exceeded revenues, the year-end deficit of \$49,612 was \$92,000 less than expected. The Society's unrestricted funds to contribute to future operations are still in a favourable position to meet the activities planned in the up-coming 2019/2020 fiscal year.

These results continue to display the dedication of the staff and volunteers who have done an excellent job in obtaining additional funding and controlling costs. Donations and fundraising events have continued to grow through the focused efforts of staff, board members and volunteers.

The Society remains in a strong financial position to meet next year's budget, which is focused on making a greater impact by taking advantage of new government programs, such as SHINE BC, seeking to increase and diversify programs and sources of funds the Society utilizes.

From such a basis and with a renewed vision, the new Board can look forward to another successful financial year.
